- The Social Audit Network (SAN) has published `Really Telling Accounts!', a report on a Social Accounting and Audit Research Project by John Pearce and Alan Kay. See the SAN website to download the report.
- Community Business Scotland Network and the Centre for Innovation and Management, based in Hyderabad, India have obtained a grant from Lloyds TSB Foundation for Scotland to develop social accounting in India. It is hoped that this project will lead to the formation of a SAN India.
- WWF and city representatives from China, India and Denmark have launched an initiative to help cities worldwide become more sustainable – the Low-Carbon City Index – aimed at becoming `a global standard for sustainable city planning' with the emphasis on monitoring and innovation'.
- The 2008 GRI Conference on Sustainability and Transparency also included an academic conference organised jointly with the Amsterdam Business School. Presentations, podcasts and documents are now available on the GRI website. The GRI is also establishing a more formalized academic network within the GRI. If you are interested:

- The Carbon Trust has announced it has helped UK businesses save £1billion in energy costs and cut carbon emissions by 17 million tonnes since 2001. Businesses working with the Carbon Trust cut their carbon footprint by approximately two million tonnes last year an increase of around half a million tonnes compared to the previous year.
